A Surfside SANCTUARY



Encinitas found a place in National Geographic's list of the twenty best surfing towns in the world.

The beach community of Encinitas, located 25 miles north of San Diego, is unique in that it has managed to retain much of its historic charm. Well over a century old, the downtown district features several buildings original to the area that have been converted into hip new boutiques, cafes and shops of all varieties, while others are must-see stops along an educational tour of the city that examines its humble beginnings in the 1880s.

With roots in the farming and flower industries - the latter of which is still quite active -Encinitas has grown into a desirable place to settle, with a population of approximately 62,700 (2019). It was officially incorporated in 1986, uniting five distinct neighborhoods into one identity as the city of **Encinitas. Despite this coming** together, the individual communities of Historic Encinitas, New Encinitas, Cardiff-by-the-Sea, Leucadia and Olivenhain still exhibit their own characters.

Historic Encinitas, a name that means "little oaks" in Spanish,

hugs historic Highway 101 and runs along the famed beaches of the area. New Encinitas features new homes and is blossoming into a community that has the best of all worlds, seamlessly blending the joys of coastal living with a suburban feel and easy access to city conveniences. Houses in the aptly named Cardiff-by-the-Sea, sometimes simply called Cardiff, offer panoramic views along the approximately twoand-a-half-miles of gorgeous coastline. The seclusion of the beaches in Leucadia is its claim to fame, with steep bluffs and more amazing vistas to take in. The easternmost portion of

Encinitas, Olivenhain, is unsurprisingly also the most rural in feel, with winding horse trails and properties situated on large lots.

Encinitas exudes the laid-back, loose atmosphere one would expect given this distinction. With its pleasant Mediterranean climate, friendly beach vibe and a lively calendar of activities all year round, there's no doubting its allure, whether or not you choose to hang 10.

Climate & Weather

The weather in Encinitas is fantastic!
Located close to the coast, means it has a
Mediterranean climate with mild
temperatures throughout the year. The
average high temperature in Encinitas
ranges from the mid-60s in the winter
months to the mid-70s in the summer
months, while the average low temperature
ranges from the mid-40s in the winter to the
mid-60s in the summer.

On average, there are 263 sunny days per year here. During the summer months, the area can experience some occasional hot and humid days, but these are typically short-lived and followed by cooler temperatures as the ocean breeze comes in. Winters are usually mild and pleasant, with occasional rainfall.

Encinitas is known for having excellent schools, which consistently rank among the best in San Diego County. Schools are rated highly on a variety of measures including parent reviews, average test scores, equity, and GreatSchools scores.

The Encinitas Union School District serves students in kindergarten through sixth grade, with six elementary schools located throughout the Encinitas area. And the Cardiff School District consists of two award-winning schools; Cardiff Elementary School serves students in grades K-2, and Ada W. Harris School serves students in grades 3-6.

The <u>San Dieguito Union High School District</u> serves students in grades 7-12 in the coastal communities of northern San Diego County, including Encinitas. The district operates five middle schools grade 7-8 and four high schools grades 9-12. The district also offers an alternative education high school program at the Sunset High School campus in Encinitas.

Canyon Crest Academy and San Dieguito Academy high schools are designated as schools of choice for grade 9-12 students who reside within the district and participate in the established high school selection process in February prior to the next school year.

Moonlight State Beach

The beach is known for its wide and sandy shorelines, gentle waves, and beautiful scenery. It is a favorite destination for locals and visitors alike. A popular for swimming, sunbathing, and surfing, it's a beach the whole family will enjoy with a playground, snack shack, restrooms, volleyball, picnic tables and benches.

Swami's Beach

San Elijo State Beach

A long, beautiful stretch of sand accessible by stairs from the cliffs above. Popular campground perched on the cliffs offers showers and picnicking. The nearby reef is popular with snorkelers and divers and is within walking distance of shops and restaurants.

Institute of Contemporary Art

An organization dedicated to experimental art and learning. Featuring an adventurous, diverse array of exhibitions, installations, public programs, and classes that will unfold in its galleries in Balboa Park and Encinitas and via site-specific installations in SD.

San Diego Botanic Garden

Check out this 37-acre urban oasis designed for children and adults, alike; with miles of garden trails, restful vistas, flowering trees, and majestic palms . . . explore your interests, learn about the plant world, and let nature fill you with a little wonder.


<u>Self Realization Fellowship Temple and Meditation Gardens</u>

Encinitas Parks and Recreation

In addition to managing the city's parks and open spaces, Encinitas Parks and Recreation also offers a wide range of recreational programs and activities for residents of all ages. These programs include youth sports leagues, adult fitness classes, art and music classes, and community events such as concerts and festivals.

Magdalena ECKE Family YMCA

Is a community-focused facility that offers a wide range of programs and services for people of all ages and abilities. They offer a variety of programs for children, including early learning and preschool programs, after-school care, and summer camps. The facility also offers youth sports leagues, swim lessons, and classes in art, music, and dance. Adults can take advantage of a variety of fitness classes and the facility also offers personal training, massage, and physical therapy services.

The Encinitas Library




RENTING:

North County Transit District

The NCTD is responsible for public transportation in Northern San Diego County, California, They manage the COASTER commuter rail service between Oceanside and San Diego, the SPRINTER hybrid rail service between Escondido and Oceanside, the BREEZE transit bus service. Overall, the Encinitas Chamber of Commerce plays an important role in promoting economic development and supporting the business community in Encinitas.


